This exhibition showcases original artwork created by K-12 students with disabilities from schools throughout Kentucky. This exhibit will travel to schools and other community venues statewide.

The 2022 Student Traveling Exhibit represents 19 schools with 31 pieces. Students expressed themselves using a variety of artistic media like acrylics, watercolor, tempera, pencil, markers, crayons and mixed media. These young artists have produced imaginative works of art using collage, drawing, and painting techniques.
