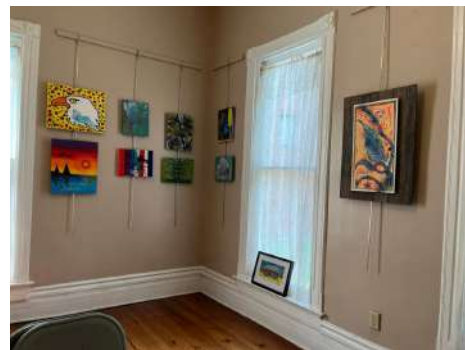

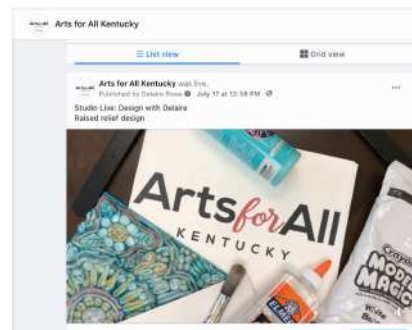
The 2023 Student Traveling Exhibit will be displayed at the Gateway Regional Arts Center in Mt. Sterling in July and August.
