Arts Inclusion

This is an opportunity for classroom teachers (academic, special education, art teachers/specialists) and artists (in the arts disciplines of dance, drama, literary arts, music, storytelling, or visual arts) to work together to plan a fully inclusionary hands-on arts project for a group as small as 25 students with and without disabilities, to much larger groups.

Student Traveling Exhibition

This art exhibit is available to schools, museums, businesses, libraries, and hospitals across the Commonwealth each year. Teachers are encouraged to submit their students' original artwork each fall in order to participate in the exhibition.

Side by Side @ School

The Side by Side program is designed to offer a creative outlet for students, reinforce positive self-image, and highlight the importance of arts education in the development of children and youth with disabilities. Additionally students have the opportunity to create alongside a professional artist and see their work exhibited in a gallery setting or perform at a public venue.

Special Initiatives

The Special Initiative program supports projects that might not fit other program guidelines but do fulfill the mission of Arts for All Kentucky. These may include festivals, camps, workshops, etc.

Teaching Artist Mentoring
