#### Arts Inclusion Program

Experiential, inclusionary arts projects in creative writing, dance, drama, music, storytelling, or visual art. Arts for All Roster Artists collaborate with schools and teachers in designing and implementing residencies that interface with curriculum and enhance learning. 25-30 schools in Kentucky are each awarded \$1600 every year. We have a rolling deadline and approved projects will be awarded on a first come first served basis. In-person, visual, and hybrid projects will be considered.
